PROFILE

Born in Ancona (Italy) in 1991, in September 2015 I obtained, with honors, the Master Degree in *Urban Planning and Policy Design* (LM-48) at the School of Architecture and Society of Politecnico di Milano (Italy), with a thesis titled "Beyond the longitudinality. A territorial re-composition project for the Tronto Valley in Italy" (supervisor: prof. Marco Mareggi).

In November 2015, I started the PhD program in *Urban and Regional Development* (XXXI cycle) at the Doctoral School of Politecnico di Torino, and I obtained the degree in January 2019 with the thesis "*Urban/rural co-productions. Planning and governance approaches for improving the relationships among city and countryside in Italy and England*" on the role of planning in improving the spatial and functional interdependencies between city and countryside in three case studies between Italy and England (supervisors: prof. Giuseppe Cinà, DiST/POLITO, and dr. Matthew Reed, CCRI/University of Gloucestershire). In 2017, as part of the doctoral research, I was visiting research fellow at the Countryside and Community Research Institute (CCRI) of the University of Gloucestershire (United Kingdom) to investigate the planning policies in the city-region of Bristol, one of the case studies of my thesis, under the supervision of my thesis co-director Matthew Reed. In 2019 I won the "Quality Award 2018" of the DiST Department of the Polytechnic of Turin, which is given every year by the Doctoral School (SCUDO) of Politecnico di Torino to two PhD students who have distinguished themselves for merits in their research activity.

As far as teaching is considered, from 2016 to 2021, following annual peer selections, I carried out tutorship in Urban Planning and Urban Design at the Polytechnic Universities of Milan and Turin. From September 2020 to June 2021, I was Lecturer in Urbanism theory and practice at the Landscape Architecture and Urban Design Department (LAUD) of Bilkent University (Ankara). Since September 2021, I am Adjunct Professor at the School of Architecture, Urban Planning and Construction Engineering (AUIC) of Politecnico di Milano, teaching in the Planning Studio of the Bachelor Degree in Architectural Design held at the Piacenza campus.

Between 2017 and 2019 I was member of the research group "Housing policies of the Olivetti company" coordinated by Marcella Turchetti (AASO). We carried on a research co-funded by the Olivetti Historical Archive Association (AASO) aimed at investigating Olivetti's housing programmes. As part of the research, I studied the activity of the Olivetti Housing Consulting Office directed by the Architect Emilio A. Tarpino.

During 2019 I carried out a consulting and research activity at the Municipality of Castelvetrano in Sicily which led to drafting a document of planning strategies and guidelines for the environmental regeneration of Triscina, a settlement characterised by high rates of informal housing.

Between April 2019 and March 2020, I held a postdoctoral research fellowship in Spatial Planning at the Department of Urban and Regional Planning and Studies (DiST) of Politecnico di Torino as part of the research "Ecowelfare and Inter-municipal Governance: soil as the infrastructure for territorial regeneration" coordinated by prof. Carolina Giaimo. Alongside the aforementioned research, I have dealt with the formulation of policies for the sustainable planning of periurban areas, opting to contribute to the new Territorial Plan of the Metropolitan City of Turin.

Since May 2020 and June 2021, I held a postdoctoral research fellowship in Spatial Planning at the Social Policies Lab of the Department of Architecture and Urban Studies (DASTU) of Politecnico di Milano as part of the H2020 Research COHSMO "Inequality, Urbanisation and Territorial Cohesion. Developing the European Social Model of Economic Growth and Democratic Capacity". The research activity was supervised by proff. Carolina Pacchi and Costanzo Ranci.

In July 2021, I started my 3rd year of postdoc fellowship working at the research project "Coltivare_Salute.com: le Case della Salute come occasione di rigenerazione urbana e sociale" supervised by proff. Marco Mareggi and Michele Ugolini.

Between 2019 and 2021, I have also been member of two research groups involved in researches on themes of social interest funded by private foundations in cooperation with universities and local institutions. The first one is the research "Atlante del cibo di Monsampolo e della Valle del Tronto" funded by CARISAP Foundation and the Municipality of Monsampolo del T. and coordinated by Massimo Sargolini (University of Camerino) and aimed at elaborating a new food plan for the municipality of Monsampolo del T. The second one is "A scuola di spazio pubblico", research funded by Fondazione Compagnia di San Paolo and coordinated by Carolina Giaimo (Polytechnic University of Turin) having the purpose of investigating the school-city relationship in Turin.

In 2017 I founded the Laboratorio del Cammino (LdC), a national inter-university network which develops research and teaching projects aimed at exploring the contribution of walking in innovating planning education in Italian universities. Alongside the LdC, I coordinated four editions of the Walking Summer School, in Central Italy (ViaSalaria, 2017), Sicily (Sicilia coast to coast, 2018), Sardinia (Sardinia Reloaded, 2019) and Piemonte (Recycland, 2021) which involved nine Italian universities (Politecnico di Torino, Politecnico di Milano, University of Palermo, University of Camerino, University of Cagliari, L'Orientale University of Naples, University of Basilicata, University of Teramo, University of Pescara) and a total of about 220 students.

Since 2017 I am a member of the "Young Academics and Professionals" (YAP) Team of the AESOP "Sustainable Food Planning" thematic group with which in 2018 I organized and coordinated an International Workshop entitled "Towards Sustainable City Region Food Systems" promoted by DiST / Polytechnic of Turin, to which 25 young researchers from all over Europe took part.

The main themes of my research and professional activity concern: the integration of food-related issues in spatial planning processes and policies; peri-urban and urban/rural relationship planning; the analysis and transformation of urban and territorial governance processes, with particular reference to the Italian and English domestic contexts. A further research trajectory concerns the experimentation of walking as a pedagogical and research methodology for investigating vulnerable territories and 'lagging behind' regions in Italy.
